The college requires prompt and accurate reporting of all criminal or suspected criminal matters occurring on campus or on property owned or managed by the college. All crimes are reported to the local police and the Dean of Operations. Maintenance and Operations is responsible for night and week-end security on college property.

A crime log is maintained on the college website. Reports are made to the college community when crimes or other activity presents a threat to students or employees. Each semester the Dean of Operations is responsible for ensuring that currently enrolled students; students applying for admissions and employees are notified regarding the availability of the campus crime log. A social task force was formed in 2004 to help the college and community deal with an increasing drug problem. The task force working with the UNITE organization formed two student drug coalitions on campus.

A variety of seminars are presented each year to students and employees. These programs include diversity, sexual harassment, computer security, FERPA training, work place violence, and general crime prevention. A number of administrators attend training seminars each year. The college has a safety-crisis management plan and the team will assist the college in times of emergencies.
