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HCTC SUPERVISOR TRAINING SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULTS SUMMARY – SPRING 2013

During the 2012-2013 academic year, HCTC supervisors participated in a supervisor training series. A 12-question survey was developed to assess the effectiveness of the training series. A copy of the survey instrument is attached to this report. Supervisors responded to the survey during the period of April 25-May 1, 2013.

A total of 17 of the 37 (or 46%) supervisors responded to the survey. Please see the attached Survey Results report for the specific totals and percentages. SUMMARY STATEMENT

The supervisors who responded to the survey were completely satisfied with the supervisor training series. All 10 satisfaction survey items received 100% satisfaction. Some supervisors did not offer an opinion on survey items #3 "The length of each session was adequate;" #6 "I have applied the content contained in the sessions;" #9 "As a result of this training, I feel more confident in my capacity as a supervisor;" and #10 "Questions were encouraged and answered promptly."
