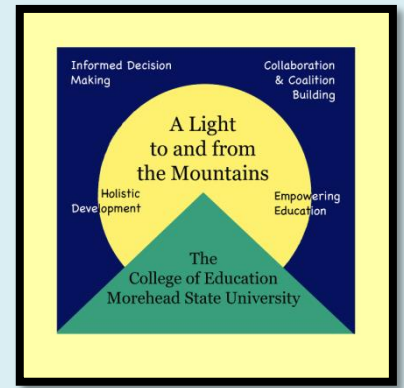


# W elcome to Teacher Education at Morehead State University!

As you begin your journey toward becoming a professional educator, we want to offer you some guidelines for success.

These guidelines are important because unlike other “majors” like English, Biology, or History, teacher education is also a program of professional preparation. This means there are requirements beyond the basic rules of the University which must be fulfilled.



**F**irst of all, you need to be aware that teacher education is a **selective** program. That means not everyone who says they want to be a teacher may qualify because the standards for full admission to the program and graduation are higher than the general University requirements. To be fully accepted into teacher education and graduate with certification **all candidates must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.75**. In addition, all programs require candidates to have a **grade of at least a “C” in certain critical courses**.

**Y**ou will need to be **admitted to the Teacher Education Program (TEP)** before you will be permitted to register for your upper level educational methods courses. In most programs this means **you should apply in the second semester of your sophomore year or first semester of your junior year**. To qualify you must have the required GPA, successfully complete most general education and several introductory education courses, demonstrate basic skills by obtaining required scores on the **Praxis: Core Academic Skills for Educators**, submit a quality admission portfolio, and successfully interview with a panel of program faculty. Please consult with your advisor to develop a plan for fulfilling all of these requirements. If you wait until the last minute you will be out of luck.

**I**n planning your course schedule you need to remember that experience in P-12 classrooms is an essential part of teacher education. Prior to your student teaching semester you will need to complete at least **200 hours of field experience**. Much of this will be required in your educational methods courses, but some of it will need to be scheduled on an independent voluntary basis by you. Of course, field experience in schools with school age children must be scheduled when school is in session—so it is important to take this into consideration when planning your personal schedule.

Make sure you **meet with your advisor and develop a plan for program completion** which is based on the program **curriculum map**, **your official program evaluation**, and the regular rotation of courses at your campus. Most education courses have other courses which are **pre-requisites** and if you have not taken the pre-requisite you cannot take the course thereby delaying your graduation. Also some programs have groups of courses which are linked in “blocks” and must be taken together.

All areas of teacher education have required **PRAXIS certification examinations** which must be passed in order to be certified. **You are required to pass these examinations before you can begin your student teaching semester**.

*So how do you stay on top of all this?* You **work closely with your advisor** and plan ahead to **meet all required deadlines**. Also, as you begin your first MSU education course you will purchase a **subscription to Folio180**, the Teacher Education Database, which will keep a complete record of your progress through teacher education.

**Special Instruction:** All teacher education candidates are advised to apply for Teacher Education Program (TEP) admission in the second semester of their second year.

**TEP Admissions Requirements:**

1. Completion of 30 semester hours
2. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
3. The following test scores

**Praxis: Core Academic Skills for Educators (CASE) - Beginning September 1, 2014**

Reading (5712) – 156

Writing (5722) – 162

Mathematics (5732) – 150

4. Successful completion of prerequisite courses or the KCTCS equivalent courses, with grades of "C" or better (ENG 100, ENG 200, COMS 108, EDF 207, and EDF 211) and prescribed clinical and field experiences.
5. Completion of and successful evaluation by program faculty of an admission interview demonstrating 1) effective communication, 2) creativity, 3) critical thinking, 4) ability to effectively collaborate with others, and 5) an understanding of the professional dispositions required of teachers.

These requirements are subject to change so consult with your advisor for current TEP admission requirements

- \* All required PRAXIS exams must be passed, all education methods courses completed, 200 field hours completed, and 75% of other course work completed to enroll in student teaching.
